



Introduction to Forest School Ethos & Principles OCN Level 1 Norfolk, November 2018 – Holt Hall

The OCN Level 1 Introduction to Forest School Principles course is nationally recognised and is accredited through the Open College Network West Midlands Region (OCNWMR). It is aimed at anyone over the age of 16 wanting to experience a taste of the Forest School ethos. It has helped practitioners to gain confidence in working outside with children and supported some to decide to go on with their training and become Forest School Leaders (Level 3).

Course Contents

Introduction to Forest School Principles consists of 3 OCN credits contained in one unit of study:
Introduction to Forest School Ethos & Principles.

The training equates to 30 hours of work and is a combination of training, a visit to an established Forest School and short written workbook.



Entry Criteria

The level 1 course is a simple introduction to Forest School, thus the only entry criteria is to be over 16 years of age. No prior knowledge of Forest School is needed.

(Please note that some Forest School practitioners might charge visitors a fee to cover their time). You may also
