## Venue - Pridgeon's belt, west acre

We are fortunate enough to be able to use a beautiful piece of woodland within the West Acre Estate thanks to the Birkbeck family and The Outrageous Nature Community Interest Company.

Please be aware that this venue is fairly 'rustic' and does not have any indoor space. We will be outside all day every day! There is no mains water on site, however there is a compost loo available and we will have jerry cans of drinking water available. In wet weather we will rig shelters but it is essential you have appropriate and adequate outdoor clothing and footwear to be comfortable.

The woodland is a couple of minutes drive from the A47, roughly halfway between Swaffham and King's Lynn.

## STUDENTS WISHING TO 'TOP UP'

The modular format of training is designed to be flexible to meet learners needs, therefore it is possible for students who have recently gained a level 2 Forest School Qualification to 'top-up' their training to level 3 . Ideally the level 2 qualification will have been gained within 2 years before the start date of the level 3 course and was undertaken with FSTC.

If you did your level 2 with a different training provider and wish to 'top-up' please contact us before booking to discuss options. All students are encouraged to attend the immersion day at the start of the course, but then people who have done level 2 can omit Modules $1 \& 2$.

## Prices

FSTC prices are fully inclusive of all course costs, including; qualification registration \& certification, marking \& moderation, administration, course support resources \& access to equipment, student website access, and tutorial support. There are no 'hidden extras' and we do not charge our students for late submission of work (unless the submission date has gone beyond what is required by the moderators).

*Delivery Assessments - at level 3, students are assessed for leadership skills by an assessor travelling to the student's FS site \& observing practice. We also use this visit as an opportunity to provide tailored advice and support to students about their Forest School site \& situation to help them action plan for future development. In order to provide this service, an additional charge of $£ 75$ plus 45 p mile is levied for students working outside a 30 -mile radius of the training venue.

## FIRST AID TRAINING

Level 3 students will need to hold an appropriate Outdoor First Aid certificate (we recommend doing one that is at least 16 hour and that covers the age groups you intend on working with) before they run their introductory Forest School Programme (after module 5).

In Norfolk, there are regular opportunities to undertake a 16 hour First Aid for Forest School course hosted by Rooted in Nature. Please check their website for forthcoming courses -www.rootedinnature.org.uk/first-aid-safety-courses/

## Running yOur forest school programme

The level 3 course is a practitioners accreditation, it is designed to equip you with everything you need to begin running your own Forest School programmes.

Part of the course is to set up and run an introductory Forest School programme of at least 6 sessions with the same group of learners. This is due to take place after the training modules and one of our tutors will make a visit to observe one of your sessions.

You will need to make arrangements during the course to be able to undertake this, including:

- Finding an appropriate site
- Finding an appropriate group (can be of any age)
- Communicating with stakeholders
- Obtaining appropriate permissions \& insurances
- Undertaking appropriate safety checks
- Planning, observation \& evaluation processes
- Undertaking appropriate environmental surveys Further information and support about how to do this is part of the training course.
